CHARITY COMMISSION.

In the Matter of The SCHOOL CHARITY, founded
by Abigail Bailey and Ann Levett, in the Parish
of CHELVESTON-WITH-CALDECOT, in the
County of NORTHAMPTON, of which Trustees
were last appointed by an Order of the Charity
Commissioners of the 20th January 1874; and

In the Matter of "The Charitable Trusts Acts, 1853
to 1894."

The Board of Charity Commissioners for England
and Wales, upon an application made to them on the
9th April 1894, in writing, signed by

The Reverend JAMES DUN, Vicar of the above-
mentioned Parish of Chelveston-with-Caldecot;
and

JAMES MOYES GRAY, and
JOHN SHARPE, the Churchwardens of the same
Parish;

then being a majority of the Trustees or persons acting in the
administration of the above-mentioned Charity:

And it appearing that the endowments of the Charity
consist of the particulars mentioned in the Schedule hereto:

And after due notice of the intention to make this Order
published according to the direction of the Board by being
affixed to or near a principal outer door of the School at
Chelveston, and the Parish Church of Chelveston, on the
11th November 1894, and also sent through the Post on the
19th April 1895, to

THOMAS CHETTLE, and

NATHANIEL MARTIN, both of Chelveston, the
persons in whom the legal estate in the site and
buildings of the School of the Charity appears to
be vested;

and on the 3rd November 1897 (being in each case more than
one calendar month previously to the date hereof), to

The present CHURCHWARDENS of the Parish of
Chelveston-with-Caldecot;

being those of the Trustees of the Charity who did not join in
the said application, at their respective last known places of
abode in Great Britain or Ireland:

And having received no notice of any objection to the
proposed Order, or suggestion for the variation thereof:

Do hereby Order as follows, viz.:—

1. HENRY EDWARD DISBROWE WISE, of Walton
Hall, in the County of Derby, Esquire;
2. SAMUEL DENTON, of Chelveston Lodge, Farmer;
3. GEORGE WYLDEN, of Chelveston, Farmer; and
4. JOHN CHETTLE, of Potterspury, Farmer;

are appointed to be Trustees for the administration of the
Charity, in addition to, and jointly with,

The VICAR and CHURCHWARDENS for the time
being of the Parish of Chelveston-with-Caldecot:

2. The right to recover and receive all debts and other things in action, due to or recoverable for the benefit of the Charity, shall forthwith vest in the said Trustees hereby appointed, individually, jointly with the continuing Trustees, in trust for the Charity:

3. The lands and hereditaments specified in the Schedule hereto, and all other freehold and leasehold lands and hereditaments (if any) belonging to or held in trust for the Charity, so far as the same are not already so vested, shall forthwith vest in "The Official Trustee of Charity Lands" for all the estate and interest therein belonging to or held in trust for the Charity.
